	INTRAVENOUS ANETHESIA
	• Intravenous (IV) medications are given to produce a semiconscious or unconscious condition. You will have a nasal mask and IV.
(• The numbing injections in surgery are accomplished while you sleep.
,	Nothing to eat or drink for at least six hours preoperatively (food or drink).
	 You should take any prescription medications as you normally would with a small sip of water.
,	• You <u>must</u> have a responsible adult with you before, during, and after the procedure to drive you home and watch after you for the remainder of the day.
	 You should wear comfortable, loose clothing.
	• Remove all of your jewelry before the appointment.
1	• If you wear contact lenses, please remove them and wear your eyeglasses instead.
	• Remove any nail polish and artificial nails from at least the index finger of each hand before your appointment. This is very important for monitoring purposes during the procedure.
